BACKGROUND:

All Backward Classes and Economic Development Organization (ABCEDO), Samaram Bazar is a non-profit, non-political, non-religious, Non-Sectarians, Secular voluntary organization registered under Societies Registration Act 1989 (Manipur Act, 1 of 1990) bearing Registration No. 3 of 1988-89. The organization has been working in the District of Thoubal, Chandel, Kakching and Noney with its head office at Samaram Bazar, P.O.Wangjing-795148, P.S. Khongjom, Thoubal District, Manipur. The organization has been working for about 34 years for the welfare of rural poor needy persons as well as most disadvantaged groups of people of the community particularly rural sections of the society. The organization was established by group of local artisans and has been providing support to the most disadvantaged sectors of the community by encouraging their active participation at all levels so as to develop a self reliant society with a focus on socioeconomic empowerment of the community especially women as decision makers in the development process.

It has been undertaken various social commendable programs in the field of Women and child welfare project, Health & Family Welfare, Literacy Education & Environment & Sanitation, Agriculture Development, Welfare Programs for women in difficult circumstances, Handicraft Development, Women Empowerment, and Socio-Economic Developmental Programme with main focus of Integrated Development of the Society.

OBJECTIVES:

The main objectives of the organization is to work for the overall development of the deprived, rural poor needy women & most disadvantaged communities irrespective of castes, creed and religion so that they may contribute positively and become part of development process. For achieving this objective, All Backward Classes and Economic Development Organization has taken up several projects/ programs through which disadvantaged/vulnerable sections of the society, through their active involvement at all levels so as enable to manage their own affairs and in turn become self-reliant and become part of development efforts.

NETWORKING OF THE ORGANIZATION:

As the All Backward Classes and Economic Development Organization (ABCEDO), Samaram Bazar, Thoubal District, Manipur has developed strong networking with more than 1530 voluntary organizations working in throughout the State as well as outside the state of India and has also established very good rapport with State Government, Central Government and other Departments, as well as funding agencies. It has got adequate technical and managerial strength to provide guidance and give technical assistance to these voluntary organizations.

AREA SPECIFIC STRUCTURAL PRESENCE:

ABCEDO has a team of 58 staffs (both Full and Part Time) 2145 volunteers and 8 highly experience consultants drawn from various field of specialization. It has 12 (twelve) computer sets, Six Xerox Machine, Six Scanners, Six Generators, Six no. of two wheelers, Well Furniture, Fixtures, Training Hall, Recreation Hall, Library Room and Electronic Equipment's like TV, EVD, DVD, Player PA system, Power Projector and other training materials.

BRIEF NOTE ON METHOD OF OPERATION REPORTING AND DOCUMENTATION ADOPTED IN THE ORGANIZATION:

ABCEDO worked on the Principal of democracy. There is program Advisory Committee, Advisory Committee, which provided program direction to the organization. The Executive body of the organization also meets 10/12 times a year and also provided strategic direction in the programs. ABCEDO keeps separate records for different programs both in Software and Files. It also has system of keeping different accounts for different projects. All Progress Reports and documents are prepared in time with the donor requirements. ABCEDO has a system of computerized accounting and it keeps all records in Tally Software.

SYSTEM IN PLACE FOR TECHNICAL AND FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT:

Regular monthly meeting are conducted every month with the entire project/ office staff. As Programmatic decisions are taken in the monthly meetings. These meetings are conducted in a participating manner and collective decision-making is done in all organizational matters. Reporting relationship is also maintained both upwards and downwards with regular flow of information. The Board also reviews the work of the organization and gives necessary directions based on feedbacks from field officers. As far as financial management is concerned ABCEDO is guided by transparency in operations, and accounts are maintained in systematic manner at all levels. Monthly financial statement is prepared to monitor the financial status of each project. All the accounts, Cash Book and Ledger Books are maintained on weekly basis. For different projects, Separate book of accounts are maintained and the some are audited by an external auditor. ABCEDO has also maintained separate account for different projects.

ABOUT THE HOME:

ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys, Samaram was established and became functional from 29th November, 2015 with the primary objective to provide protection and care to juvenile boys in conflict with law (CCL). It has a provision for capacity of 25 boys in its maximum capacity. Further, on 09th March 2017, it is notified as 'Place of Safety' for boys, on temporary basis by the Government of Manipur and was serving as the only institution in the state of Manipur till July 2022. In its functioning as the Observation Home for Boys and Place of Safety, the home goes in compliance with the Juvenile Justice Act (JJ Act), 2015 under the direction of Social Welfare Department, Government of Manipur. As an institution that prioritize on creating a "Child Friendly Environment", the year 2022-23 has following staffs assigned and served under the designations and with responsibilities as:

With the very objective to provide care and protection to children having conflict with law and also individuals or adults having been in conflict with law during their juvenile age, each one who stayed in the Observation Home of ABCEDO's is provided with all the basic amenities and requirement as per the guideline (of JJ Act) which includes items such as mattress, pillow, bed sheet, blankets, mosquito nets, shirt & trouser, towel, undergarments, sleeper, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, washing powder, cupboard etc for each individual separately. Besides a strict daily routine is also followed for the cultivation of a proper physical and mental growth among the boys.

The home also has a section called Special Unit which serves children that needs extra care and protection. Its main activities includes the provision of specially focus and oriented counseling, health check-up, education and other interventions. In the year 2022-2023, there were Seven children under Special Unit. One among them was HIV positive and under ART. He was taken extra care for his diet, medication and health status.

ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys and Place of Safety, as an institution has a sole objective to create a child friendly environment; and cultured the boys to engage themselves in a productive way and direct towards a better path. So, as per the direction of JJ Act 2015, ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys and Place of Safety, Samaram, make every residing child to engage in a productive daily routine and undergoes with multiple skill development trainings and activities. Besides, the boys are also made to go through numerous counseling sessions (Individuals as well as Group Counseling) and routine medical examination to have a positive outlook towards life and maintain a healthy living. The home also have organized and made the boys engaged with different participatory and innovative activities to mold for a better development – physically and mentally.

DAILY ROUTINE AND MAIN ACTIVITIES:

A day in ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys and Place of Safety, Samaram is composed by the residents following the daily routine and its associating activities. Being a home for protection and care of Juvenile, the daily routine tries to promote a healthy leaving through routine exercise, games and sport, acquiring new skills, developing positive habits and most importantly respecting, coordinating and developing bond of love and brotherhood among the residents and staffs. The daily routine as followed in the observation home of ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys and Place of Safety, Samaram is:

After arise and Personal Cleaning, the day starts with morning assembly with an 'All faith prayer' which continues with exercise and yoga sessions. So, each individual begins the day with a prayer remembering and offering to the one on whom he has supreme faith. The routine physical exercise is perform in the open lawn situated inside the close campus of the observation home as boys are not allowed the cross the inner gate of the observation home. Morning exercise is followed by breakfast.

ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys and Place of Safety, Samaram provides the best possible quality and quantity of food which consist a healthy breakfast, lunch, evening tea and dinner. The food routine as provided includes non-vegetarian dishes twice a week and consist of fresh seasonal vegetables and pulses extensively for a healthy growth.

After breakfast, personal time is given to the boys till lunch time. During this period boys are made to access to newspaper, comics, magazine etc or wash cloths, cut hair, nails or practice skill development work according to personal choice. Post lunch a short rest period is given after which a very important technical session is kept for everyday from 11:00 AM to 01:00 PM except on holiday or days having functions. The session is composed of Counseling, skill development training programs, book reading sessions and meditation.

In ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys & Place of Safety, Counselling Sessions in the form of face to face interactive sessions were conducted regularly. The goal of such sessions is to support children by improving their mental state and set them on a path to becoming a productive citizen. Through such sessions, the counselor helps the boys to strengthen their confidence and remove the stigma and other demoralizing effects from their mind and enable them to cope with their situation in life and offers them concrete advice for dealing with their problems.

In the year 2022-2023, we have given counseling to 30 boys residing in the Observation Home for Boys & Place of Safety. The juveniles in the Observation home & Place of Safety of ABCEDO's have cases of diverse nature. Out of the 30 boys, 14 of them are related with POCSO Act, 06 of them with Narcotic Drugs & Psychotropic Substances Act and 05 of them for involvement with unlawful activities (UAPA). Another 02 of them are booked under IPC and the remaining 03 under Foreigners Act 1943, who are Burmese citizens and they are held culprit for illegal crossing of the border into Manipur. The Burmese boys are given proper counseling through an interpreter and two of them are still under the guidance of the Observation Home.

Each child is given with individual and group counseling sessions according to their needs and demands. The results did shown found to be very effective which were reflected in their changed behaviour and their attitudes towards life. Out of the total 30 boys which went through counseling sessions, most of boys did underwent specific and distinctive changes in their character and they started moving towards an optimistic future, developing positive coping methods, as well as boosting self-esteem, self-confidence, and other positive traits while leaving the home to pursue their dream with a positive outlook towards life. Mention may be made of one boy Sudhir (not real name), who were booked in for illegal activities, and he has been brought back to normalcy through our counseling sessions. This boy had been facing many family problems at such a young age. His mother left him at an early age of around 8 years when she left her father and married to another man. His father was also a physically disabled person and could not earn for his family. Thus, he was grown up without any parental care and supervision. Being the eldest son, he took the role of the sole bread earner of his family and helped his father and his siblings. However, due to the bad influences of his friends and also due to the above sufferings he faced at an early age, many negative thoughts started developing in his mind. He started searching for quick earning businesses which landed him to the evil activities of associating with underground militants and committing heinous acts of throwing bombs to the Army, and for which he was brought under the care of our Home. In his first counseling session, he talked a lot about how much hatred he had for his mother and even mentioned that he was going to kill his own mother. He was also reluctant to talk much and disclose his problems to the counselor clearly. He seemed like a boy in serious mental distress and who needs proper care and attention. After attending our series of individual as well as group counseling sessions, he started feeling comfortable in sharing his story and problems to the counselor. We were able to remove his negative attitudes slowly and showed him the bigger aspects of life by inculcating positive values. He started feeling the importance of his life and how valuable he was to his family. Finally, he was made to talk to his mother, met her and under her care, he left the Home with a drastic change in his attitude towards life. After leaving the home, he started his own business shop and helped his family while keeping in touch with his mother also.

Another one is the case of Gobind Singh (not real name), who were brought under the POCSO Act and through our series of effective counselling, had undergone sensible transformation in his behaviour. It is learned that, after leaving the home, he has started leading a normal life, lending help and support to his family while continuing his studies also. Same is the case of Md Imtiyaz from Mayang Imphal. Our counselor has well understanding of the individual differences amongst the boys and thus specific guidance and instructions are provided to each individual separately. Many of them, who have lost their interest in study, have been guided and restored back to their learning intentions. It would be useful to mention here that 03 boys, staying in the Home, are also appearing in the HSLC Examination 2022 conducted by the BOSEM.

Further, our counselor also gives extra attention to them throughout their studies providing them with the books and other necessary resources. As mentioned above also, the individual differences amongst the boys are duly noted and they have been guided to pursue their different dreams in life with a positive attitude. Of the total 30 boys 13 boys continued to stay in the home by the end of March 2023 and were undergoing counseling sessions.

As part of the counseling session, the boys are also made to engage in various activities such as meditation, storytelling, role play, acts, drawing sessions and cognitive skill oriented activities in order to rejuvenate their mind and also to instill certain skills which would be helpful in their future life. Such activities also help the counselor to identify harmful thoughts, assess whether they are an accurate depiction of reality, and, if they are not, employ strategies to challenge and overcome them so that they can lead a positive and successful life in the society. For instance, meditation, as a group activity can help the boys strengthen their self-regulation and their focus on daily routine. It also boosts their overall health, reduces negative feelings, and fosters compassion. In ABCEDO's observation home for Boys, meditation is practiced thrice a week by listening to deep meditation music, relaxing sleep music, peaceful song developed especially for the meditation program or through system of situational imagination. Storytelling activity is also conducted once a week so as to raise the enthusiasm for reading texts to find stories, to inspire purposeful talking, and also to improve their listening skills. A positive story always teach positive values and good moral to the boys. In order to develop communication and language skills and to allow the boys to act out and make sense

of real-life situations, other activities like role play, acts, etc. are also conducted regularly. Thus, the provided counseling programme which involves a lot of face to face interactive sessions can help the juveniles understand and resolve their own problems, modify their behavior, and make positive changes in their lives.

Medical examination of the boys, both at entry level as well as routine, is one of the mandatory norm for each child staying in the ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys & Place of Safety, Samaram. Record of each individual child is maintained separately by the staff nurse of the home. Entry medical check-up is performed when a child is newly admitted in the home and from that point onwards a separate file is open for that particular child until his restoration. If special medical attention is required then a concerned medical expert is called to address the issue, otherwise routine medical check-up is performed in every 10 days (thrice in a month) for each resident.

ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys, Samaram also has a special unit to look into and taken care of children who need special care. The unit along with the medical team identifies the need of the boys' who require special care. The unit deals with boys having difficulties in hearing, speaking, seeing, locomotion, mentally disturbed etc. Such boys are provided with additional support tools and equipment required.

Vocational Skill training is imparted on a regular basis but in different sectors to all the residents of the ABCEDO's Observation Home for boys. It aims the boys to acquire with certain skill which would be helpful in the times to come, economically as well as for personal use. Besides the training given on skill development, the boys are also allowed to practice the acquired skill and knowledge on daily basis.

Some of the skill development training program conducted in the year 2022-23 includes course or sessions on basic computer skill, sessions on making metal wire baskets, decorative items, painting, food processing, mushroom cultivation, making *Mora* (a traditional sitting tool), knitting woolen shoes etc. Short term skill development training programs were especially chosen and given importance in ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys & Place of Safety, Samaram as many of the boys stayed in the observation home for a very short duration; and also newly arrived child could easily pick-up without missing much which is not possible with long duration courses.

After the afternoon tea, the boys proceed for games and sports. As the home doesn't own a field for playing football, they are allowed to play Badminton, Carom, Chess, Chinese checker etc. Regularly, friendly matches are also organized for the boys to develop game spirit and promote healthy competitions. A short period is kept in daily routine for personal cleaning and taking bath before the study period. In ABCEDO's Observation Home and Place of Safety, Samaram, evening study period is given due importance as most of the boys are studying, even though they are not allowed to attend school from the home. However, instances happen in which some boys are not enrolled to schools or drop out many years back. The home makes best possible efforts to make them able to read and develop reading habit. In its extreme cases, such out of school boys are allowed to watch television while others are engaged in study period. Post dinner, boys are allowed to continue either with their study or watch television according to one's choice. By 9:30 PM, every boy is made to be compulsorily in their respective beds and switch off the light.

REGULAR WEEKLY ACTIVITIES

Besides the daily routine which constitutes the main activities for the boys staying in the ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys and Place of Safety, there are certain other activities which are performed on weekly or monthly basis. Also, major festivals, irrespective of religion and community, are also celebrated with much fun and joy. Staffs are also fully encouraged to participate and spend maximum time with the boys in all such celebrations.

WEDNESDAY PROGRAM:

Every Wednesday afternoon, post skill development practice session, there is a program called 'Wednesday Program' in which activities that were already decided by the boys in the previous Wednesday are performed. Here, the activities could be in form of group work or individual performances. In 2022-23, individual performances conducted includes quiz competition, story writing, poem writing, recitation, one act play, extempore etc while group work includes drama competition, group quiz competition, problem solving exercise etc. The main objective behind 'Wednesday Program' is to develop extra-curricular abilities among the boys.

STORY TELLING:

The session on story reading is held every Saturday afternoon in which one boy is assigned with a particular story and makes him to read it out loud to the group; where the group would hear, discuss and answer the questions on the story read. The activity nourishes the reading habit of the boys and also it molds their ability to active listening, comprehension and reflectivity.

It is a fanfare event held every Saturday post the dinner. It is usually held in the lawn of the observation home. In winter, usually a bonfire is set-up for the program. Otherwise microphone, loudspeaker and music are the important component of the Saturday night program where boys sing song and do 'antakshari'.

REGULAR MONTHLY ACTIVITIES:

CHILDREN COMMITTEE MEETING:

The meeting of the Children Committee of ABCDEO's Observation Home for Boys and Place of Safety, Samaram is held once a month usually in the third week of a month. The meeting is coordinated by the Superintendent. It is held separately for the age group 6-10 years, 11-15 years and 16-18 years. The discussion mainly focuses on the issues facing by the boys personally or in group or anything which they like to propose to the home and its management committee.

HOME MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING:

Usually, on the last week of a month, the meeting of the Home Management Committee is held in the office of ABCDEO's Observation Home for Boys, Samaram. It is chaired by the District Child Protection Officer (DCPO), Thoubal and the member constitutes the Secretary, ABCDEO, Superintendent, Special Educator, Counselor, Doctor, Staff nurse, Children representative of ABCDEO's Observation Home for Boys besides the representatives of DCPU, Thoubal and JJB Thoubal. Discussions are mainly made over the management, maintenance, special needs, facilities provided, renovations, requirements and problems as observed and shared. It also discusses and plans the routine as well as Skill development program for the boys.

MONTHLY STAFF MEETING:

Generally on the 3rd of every month, the monthly staff meeting of ABCDEO's Observation Home for Boys is held in the office of the Observation Home itself. It generally discusses on the rules and regulations, role as well as the problems and prospects of the staffs. As part of the meeting staffs discuss the issues as they come across while serving their duties whether in management or maintenance or specific problems of the boys.

STATUS UPDATE TO DCPU:

On the first week of each month, an updated report regarding the details of the boys, cases involved, date of admission, duration of stay, health status and restoration information is shared with District Child Protection Unit (DCPU), Thoubal in the form of Monthly report. Further, a detail report along with information on skill development program is also shared through Quarterly report.

OTHER ACTIVITIES & CELEBRATIONS: 2022-23

14TH APRIL, 2022 – SAJIBU MEITEI CHEIRAوبا:

The new year of the Manipuri Meitei Lunar calendar was celebrated with a grand feast in the usual multi-dish fashion of the Cheiraoba spirit. Boys and staffs were excited for the day and they fully participated in preparation of the much elaborated

Cheiraoba dishes. Post lunch, all the staffs and boys sit together and resolved to the best with the advent of the New Year.



23RD APRIL, 2022 – KHONGJOM DAY:

Khongjom Day was observed to commemorate the war heroes who sacrificed their lives fighting against the British to protect the freedom of Manipur. A documentary movie on war heroes was shown to boys. Post movie session the event started depicting the war heroes through drawing and painting. It was followed by sharing their thoughts on the war heroes.

Rath Yatra was observed with the cooking of traditional food of the festival 'Khichri' and performing variety program by the boys in the evening.



ABCEDO's Children Home for Boys is segregated in certain sections and arenas, like residence, counselling, children committee, educator etc, even though they function within the same campus and under the same rule; as there is no provision for a separate staffs and administration for CCI Under the section 49 of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 ABCEDO's Children Home for Boys, Noney was notified as the Children Home for boys by the department of Social Welfare, Government of Manipur. Since then, the home is also continued serving as the Children Home providing care and protection to the needed individuals.

ABCEDO's Children Home for Boys, as an institution has a sole objective to create a child friendly environment; and cultured the boys to engage themselves in a productive way and direct towards a better path. So, as per the direction of JJ Act 2015, ABCEDO's Children Home for Boys khumji-II Noney, make every residing child to engage in a productive daily routine and undergoes with multiple skill development trainings and activities. Besides, the boys are also made to go through numerous counselling sessions (Individuals as well as Group Counselling) and routine medical examination as well as the best educator to provide and support the inmates to their education system, to have a positive outlook towards life and maintain a healthy living. The home also has organized and made the boys engaged with different participatory and innovative activities to mould for a better development – physically and mentally.

DAILY ROUTINE AND MAIN ACTIVITIES:

A day in ABCEDO's Children Home for Boys Noney is composed by the residents following the daily routine and its associating activities. Being a home for protection and care of Juvenile, the daily routine tries to promote a healthy leaving through routine exercise, games and sport, acquiring new skills, developing positive habits and most importantly respecting, coordinating and developing bond of love and brotherhood among the residents and staffs. COUNSELLING:

The counselling session which is conducted by the counsellor of the ABCEDO's Children Home for Boys, is generally hold as a face-to-face interactive session with the boys to understand the specific personal problem and help in analysing and solving the issue. The session also helps the boys in improving their attitude, behaviour and



bringing positive changes in their character. Therapy and strategies of counselling is different for different person and is exercise according to the need of the concern individual. that involves talking in which an individual share his problems with the counsellor and the counsellor, after taking note of his troubles advises him the best course to cope up with their problems.

The counsellor very well knows how to do counselling as he puts in his best efforts to acknowledge the personal as well as psychological problems of an individual that gives him mental instability and emotional pain.

The role of the counsellor is very important as he has to find out the root of a particular problem and to figure out the possible solutions for these issues. The counsellor also helps people to choose the best course of action by helping him remain positive in his life.

INDIVIDUAL COUNSELLING:

But children are the ones who need counselling more than anybody else. Sometimes students are so frustrated and tensed about their careers that they can't figure out what is right or wrong for that. These children seek the guidance of the experienced person to move on with their career.

As they do not have the right knowledge of dealing with any sociopsychological and study related issues, they arrange an individual counselling session which proves much beneficial for them. They can hope to get crisis counselling, counselling against bullying and counselling against personal issues.

ABCEDO's Children Home for Boys, Noney also has a special unit to look into and taken care of children who need special care. The unit along with the medical team identifies the need of the boys' who require special care. The unit deals with boys having difficulties in hearing, speaking, seeing, locomotion, mentally disturbed etc. support tools and equipment required.



GAMES AND SPORTS:

After the afternoon tea, the boys proceed for games and sports. they are allowed to play Badminton, Carom, Chess, Chinese checker football etc. Regularly, friendly matches are also organized for the boys to develop game spirit and promote healthy competitions.



EMPOWER STUDENTS WITH LIFE SKILLS:

While sports not only help in developing physical and mental health, it also develops the life skills of a student's personality. It enhances their capabilities and helps them to have a better understanding of themselves. Sports also help in developing social skills and getting along with people. They learn to interact not only with children of their age but also with adults like their coaches and seniors. Additionally, children acquire decision-making skills through various team activities.

LEARN TIME MANAGEMENT AND DISCIPLINE:

Constructive use of time and discipline is a major characteristic of any sports-person. If a student plays a sport, he/she needs to show the commitment of time to be in a particular place at a particular time every day as a part of their routine. He/she must be patient, disciplined which will enable the student to cope with criticism and setbacks. Each sport has a set



of rules and regulations to be followed which helps the students to stay fit and disciplined.

IMPROVED LEADERSHIP AND TEAM BUILDING QUALITIES:

Sports is all about teamwork. Jain Heritage School encourages team sports such as football, cricket, basketball etc. which gives an individual a sense of identity and belonging to a group. Such sports encourage children to showcase their talent and communicate with their team members. It also helps to identify and hone their leadership skills which add values to their personality.

WINNING AND LOSING IS ALL PART OF THE GAME:

Sports is not always about winning. It is about fair play and believing in equality and justice. Losing is a part and parcel of any game and accepting defeat in a positive competitive spirit distinguishes a true sportsperson which propels him/her to strive harder the next time to achieve what he/she missed out on the previous game.



BOOST SELF-CONFIDENCE:

Scoring a goal, hitting a six or winning a race not only makes a student happy but also it boosts their confidence. Performing in front of a crowd which is constantly noticing your each and every move can be quite unnerving. But a sports-person is one with focus, patience, the right amount of confidence having a never-say-die attitude.



Professional training is imparted to students of Jain Heritage School who are between the ages of 6-14 years. This includes three and a half hours of specialized sports training in Athletics, Basketball, Badminton, Snooker/Billiards, Cricket, Tennis, Table Tennis, Football and Swimming.

An exclusive academic program with flexible timings is designed to meet the needs of students. Training programs are designed by international/national coaches who visit the school regularly and monitor the progress of the students. Our students enjoy their round of sports at the state-of-the-art sports complex known as "KREEDA". All the above reasons show how sport and games are an integral part of the education system and must be incorporated in every school.

A short period is kept in daily routine for personal cleaning and taking bath before the study period. In ABCDEO's Children Home, evening study period is given due importance as most of the boys are studying, the home makes best possible efforts to make them able to read and develop reading habit.

REGULAR ACTIVITIES (WEEKLY AND MONTHLY)

Saturday Talent Hunt Program (Weekly Regular Activities):

Besides the daily routine which constitutes the main activities for the boys staying in the ABCEDO's Children Home for Boys Noney, there are certain other activities which are performed on weekly or monthly basis. Also, major festivals, irrespective of religion and community, are also celebrated with much fun and joy. Staffs are also fully encouraged to participate and spend maximum time with the boys in all such celebrations.



Session on storytelling is held once a week, usually on Saturday afternoon. In a session on Storytelling, a short story is chosen to 'read-out-loud' and discussed. The session aims to developed active listening, comprehension and reflectivity on the story read.

It is a fanfare event held every Saturday post the dinner. It is usually held in the lawn of the Children home. In winter, usually a bonfire is set-up for the program. Otherwise, micro-phone, loudspeaker and music are the important component of the Saturday night program where boys sing song, Dance, Drama Fashion show to show their talent.



The session aims to pick out special talent among. Recently we have pick out a special talent form the children of ABCEDO's Children Home for Boys Noney Such as naming Chunganlung studying in class VIII he is very good in Beatboxing. ABCEDO's Children Home for boys Noney is looking forward for such special talent.

MONTHLY REGULAR ACTIVITIES

Children Committee Meeting:

The meeting of the Children Committee of ABCDEO's Children Home for Boys Noney is held once a month usually in the second week of a month. The meeting is coordinated by the Superin-tendent. The discussion mainly foc uses on the issues facing by the boys personally or in group or anything which they like to propose to the home and its management committee.



Home Management Committee Meeting:

Usually, on the last week of a month, the meeting of the Home Management Committee is held in the office of ABCDEO's Children Home for Boys, Noney. It is chaired by the District Child Protection Officer (DCPO), Tamenglong and the member constitutes the Secretary, ABCDEO, Superintendent, Special Educator, Counsellor, Doctor, Staff nurse, Children representative of ABCDEO's Observation Home for Boys beside s the representatives of DCPU, Tamenglong Discussions are mainly made over the management, maintenance, special needs, facilities provided, renovations, requirements and problems as observed and shared. It also discusses and plans the routine as well as Skill development program for the boys.



Monthly Staff Meeting:

Generally, on the 25th of every month, the monthly staff meeting of ABCDEO's Children Home for Boys is held in the office of the Children Home itself. It generally discusses on the rules and regulations, role as well as the problems and prospects of the staffs. As part of the meeting staffs discuss the issues as they come across while serving their duties whether in management or maintenance or specific problems of the boys.



Status Update to DCPU And CWC noney:

On the first week of each month, an updated report regarding the details of the boys, cases involved, date of admission, duration of stay, health status and restoration information is shared with District Child Protection Unit (DCPU), Tamenlong and Child Welfare Committee CWC Noney in the form of Monthly report. Further, a detail report along with information on skill development program is also shared through Quarterly report.



OTHER ACTIVITIES & CELEBRATION 2022-2023

05th June, 2022:

World Environment Day was celebrated with boys planting trees around the observation home. In afternoon painting competition was held under the theme 'Air Pollution' (It is a big annual celebration started by the United Nations General Assembly to engage millions of people from different countries across the globe as well as draw attention of political and health organizations to implement some effective actions.)

15th August, 2022:

It was a red-letter day in the history of India when the country got her freedom on August 15, 1947. It took hundreds of years for us to break shackles of slavery. People of the country celebrate this festival every year with great pomp and show. The main Programme is celebrated at the Red Fort in New Delhi. Besides, this festival is also celebrated in every city and town, in school, college and university. Our ABCEDO's Children home Noney also observed Independence Day with boys reading out their thoughts and opinion to become a better human being; and how

ABOUT MISSION SHAKTI:

It is a scheme in mission mode funded by the Central government under Ministry of Women and Child development, Government of India, New Delhi (MWCD) with the core objective to strengthen interventions for women safety, security and empowerment. Mission Shakti has two sub-schemes: Sambal and Samarthya.

The Sub-scheme Sambal focus on the safety and security of women by integrating the existing schemes of One Stop Centre (OSC), Women Helpline (WHL), Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) with modifications and insertion of new component – Nari Adalat. While Samarthya as a sub-scheme congruent the existing schemes of Swadhar Greh, Ujjawala Home, Working Women Hostels with required modifications and changes, with addition of National Creche Scheme and Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY).

After all, the objective of the Mission Shakti is provide all the women and girls including differently-abled, socially and economically marginalized and vulnerable groups, in need of care and protection, with short term and long term services and information for their holistic development and empowerment.



ABCEDO's service area in Mission Shakti under Shakti Sadan:

As a grassroots level organization, ABCEDO has been engaging extensively with special focus being given to disowned, distressed and trafficked women by creating a safe and enable environment to overcome their difficult circumstances and make a fresh start. So, under Mission Shakti, ABCEDO is working with its focus being given to sub-scheme Samarthya and thus providing service of 'Shakti Sadan'– Integrated Relief and Rehabilitation Home, at two districts of Manipur, namely Thoubal and Chandel.

Under 'Shakti Sadan', residents are provided with shelter, food, Health Insurance , clothing, primary health facilities, Jan Dhan and other daily need items. Also, vocational training and social security benefits etc are also provided to strengthen and empowered the women who are in need of care and protections. Counseling and free legal services facilities are also provided to all the residents of ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home. Being run under the same organization, both the Shakti Sadan home of ABCEDO located in districts of Thoubal and Chandel functions by amalgamating the learning and best practices from both to provide and support the residents in best possible manner.

ABOUT THE HOME:

ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home, Samaram was earlier functioned as one of Swadhar Greh with the primary objective to provide shelter, protection and care to distress and disown women. It has a provision for capacity of 50 women in its maximum capacity. As an institution that prioritize on creating an environment to empower women, the year 2022-23 has following staffs assigned and served under the designations and with responsibilities as:

The home which comes under Mission Shakti, implemented by All Backward Classes and Economic Development Organisation (ABCEDO), Samaram Bazar, Thoubal District, Manipur under the Financial Assistance from Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India, New Delhi through State Social Welfare Department, Government of Manipur aims to provide every woman in a difficult circumstance an appropriate institutional support and thus shouldn't be left unattended and abandoned in which cases are vulnerable to further exploitation and misery. So, the scheme provides, each woman in difficult circumstances, assistance not only for the basic requirements like food, shelter, clothing, medical, counseling, legal support, Health Insurance and Jan Dhan etc but also aim to establish economic independence through various vocational training. The scheme functions under the following objectives as per the Ministry guideline:

- 1) To cater to the primary need of shelter, food, clothing, medical treatment and care of the women in distress and who are without any social and economic support.
- 2) To enable them to regain their emotional strength that gets hampered due to their encounter with unfortunate circumstances.
- 3) To provide them with legal aid and guidance to enable them to take steps for their readjustment in family/society.
- 4) To rehabilitate them economically and emotionally.
- 5) To act as a support system that understands and meets various requirements of women in distress.
- 6) To enable them to start their life afresh with dignity and conviction.

So, to fulfill the above objectives, ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home, Samaram follows the daily routine as follows:

After breakfast, personal time is given or women who are interested may practice skill development works. During this period they are also made to access to newspaper, comics, magazine etc. Post lunch a short rest period is given after which a very important technical session is kept for everyday from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM except on holiday or days having functions. The session is composed of Counseling or routine medical examination.

In ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home, Counseling Sessions in the form of face to face interactive sessions were conducted regularly. The goal of such sessions is to support women and children by improving their mental state and set them on a path to becoming a productive citizen. Through such sessions, the counselor helps the women to strengthen their confidence and remove the stigma and other demoralizing effects from their mind and enable them to cope with their situation in life and offers them concrete advice for dealing with their problems. Group Counseling were also provided minimum once in a week

As part of the counseling session, the women were also made to engage in various activities such as meditation, storytelling, role play, acts, etc in order to rejuvenate their mind and also to instill certain skills which would be helpful in their future life. Such activities also help the counselor to identify harmful thoughts, assess whether they are an accurate depiction of reality, and, if they are not, employ strategies to challenge and overcome them so that they can lead a positive and successful life in the society.

Medical examination of the women and accompanying children, both at entry level as well as routine, is one of the mandatory norm for each individual staying in the ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home, Samaram. Record of each individual is maintained separately by the concerned staff of the home. Entry medical check-up is perform when a woman was newly admit in the home and from that point onwards a separate file is open for that particular women. If special medical attention is required than a concern medical expert is called to address the issue, otherwise routine medical check-up is perform in every 10 day (thrice in a month) for each resident.

Vocational Skill training is imparted on a regular basis but in different sectors to all the residents of the ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home, Samaram. It aims the residents to acquire with certain skill which would be helpful in the times to come, economically as well as for personal use. Besides the training given on skill development, the women were also allowed to practice the acquired skill

and knowledge on daily basis. Some of the skill development training program conducted in the year 2022-23 includes sessions on making metal wire baskets, decorative items, painting, food processing, mushroom cultivation, making *Mora* (a traditional sitting tool), knitting woolen shoes etc.

As part of the service to provide temporary shelter, care and protection to every women who need institutional support, the home issued each woman with all the basic amenities and requirement which includes items such as mattress, pillow, bed sheet, blankets, mosquito nets, shirt & phanek, towel, undergarments, sleeper, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, washing powder, cupboard etc. for each individual separately.

Every Sunday afternoon, there is a program called 'Sunday Meeting' in which residents were asked to share their opinion on the events and activities conducted in the concluding week. Also, possibilities to insert and exclude activities in daily routine was discussed in this particular meeting. Thus, It provides each residents an opportunity to create their own schedule with adequate space for modification and changes.

Wednesday Night:

A fanfare event is held every Saturday post the dinner. It may be the night for screening new Manipuri Film or films on demand, cultural programme competition, singing competition or session on storytelling and creativity. This particular program makes women and children to explore and cultivate new hobbies or revisit their old expertise skills. Wednesday Night programme makes everyone laugh and enjoy.

Festival and Observations:

All the major festivals, irrespective of religion and community, are also celebrated with much fun and joy in ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home. Staffs are also fully encouraged to participate and spend maximum time with the women and children in the home in all such celebrations.

Workshop on Trafficking and Commercial Sex Worker:

ABCEDO's Sakti Sadan Home has organized workshop on Trafficking and Commercial Sex Worker at different Village of District, Manipur in close collaboration with Gram Panchayat Members, Asha Workers, Angalwadi Worker, Local Club, Women organization, Meira Paibi. In this programme, various stakeholders delivered talks about the role of NOGs, Community Leaders, Village Chiefs, Panchayat Members, Asha Worker, Angalwadi Worker and Women organization to prevent the commercial sexual exploitation, rescue the victim, Rehabilitation, re-integration and repatriation to the participants. ABCEDO's Sakti Sadan Home has also distributed 2500 nos. of leaflets, 1000 posters at major places such as Fast Food, Public Place, Bus stand and School etc. The main objective of the programme are to prevent trafficking of women and children for commercial sexual exploitation through social mobilization and involvement of local communities, awareness generation programmes, general public discourse through workshop such event and any other innovative activity and to provide rehabilitation service both immediate and long term to the victims by providing basic amenities / needs etc.

The home at Komlathabi was established in the month of April, 2019. It has the capacity of 50 women to occupy at a time. In the year 2022-2023, the home has provided institutional support to women who are victims as well as widows from economically backward family. In most of the cases, the clients/victims were being referred by other organizations or by police. Clients seeking help from Shakti Sadan home mostly come from socio economic backward background which is also the reason why they tend to be the victims of violence, disown and human trafficking. So, each client is provided with basic needs such as food, shelter, Health Insurance , Jan Dhan and clothing and also they are provided with very basic needs such as sanitary pads, mattress, mosquito nets, bed sheets, pillows, shawls, undergarments, blankets, sleepers, toothbrush, toothpastes, shampoos, soaps, washing powder, etc.

The home also gave shelter to children for a short stay until they are given proper accommodation by the appropriate authority. Since Shakti Sadan Home, Komlathabi is just a new establishment there have been not many cases that was administered in the initial months. So, few women from in and around the district of Chandel District, Manipur were given some financial help every month along with an awareness regarding the institution as well as the issue of violence against women and human trafficking. Also few awareness programs were conducted in the community, church, college and schools. To be more effective, the staffs of the home collaborated with the key persons of the community such as the Deputy Commissioner of Chandel, Superintendent of police Chandel District, Police officers, the village chiefs, church leaders, youth club leaders, etc. The collaboration is done so that enough support and corporation is received from the villages during any activity which is to be undertaken by the Home.



- In the month of June, 2022, a case of POCSO was being referred by a Child Activist NS Dargam, Chief Functionary NEEDS. Having no proper place to let the girl child stay, the child activist referred the child at ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home for temporary stay, but later in the following morning, CHILDLINE Thoubal Team took the initiative of receiving the child and giving proper accommodation.

- On 12 June 2022, ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home in collaboration with CHILDLINE Kakching, have conducted an awareness program on child labour, as part of observing World Day Against Child Labour. The staffs accompanied by Secretary of ABCEDO, Shri Kh. Tompok Singh did a poster campaign in and around Kakching area.
- In the month of October 2022, ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home in collaboration with District Mental Health Program of Chandel District have conducted an awareness program to disseminate the issues and problems of Human Trafficking and how it affects the mental health of an individual. It was conducted in the South East Manipur College, Komlathabi, Chandel District, Manipur.
- In the month of November 2022, an awareness program about child Trafficking was conducted in schools located in Kamlathabi and Kakching as well. Also awareness on CHILDLINE 1098 as well as Child Rights were also provided in collaboration with Kakching Police and CHILDLINE Collaborative Organisation, Kakching.



- Women empowerment awareness program was administered to the widows and single mothers to be self dependent and sustainable in bringing up their children on their own. In this program the women were educated on various schemes such as Self-Help Groups under various schemes and Chief Minister Widow Pension Scheme.
- The home accommodates victims belonging to various tribes and communities from various religions. So it is made sure that the inmates were given a space to worship and follow their own faith and also to celebrate their festivals.
- Activities such as singing, dancing to traditional songs, watching television, cooking therapy were also regularly conducted to entertained and also as a therapeutic step for the inmates to get away from all their trauma and experience. At the end of the day, the women will seat together and share their story without any judgmental attitude towards each other. This helps them to free themselves and know that they are being understood and listened to.



Life in ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home follows a common daily routine and activities associating with. Being a home for protection, support and care of women in difficult circumstances, the daily routine tries to promote a healthy and productive living by following a simple time table which give adequate time and space for each resident to acquire new skills and practice it to enhance their livelihood.

The day in ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home starts with morning breakfast after personal cleaning. The home tries to provide with the best possible food with the minimal financial support available from the ministry for the scheme.

Breakfast follows with either group discussion or social work or both. Usually, group discussion turns out to be very productive as many women who are newly arrived in the home, and are in the state of distress could relate to others easily. Social work is usually performed in order to keep the residents need and clean. It also gives the sense of responsibility to the place where one stays. The routine then follows with personal time till lunch during which an individual can read newspaper or do washing or other productive work such as practice of skill development work or other economically useful engagement as many women goes out for petty business.

Post lunch has a compulsory session on counseling or medical examination. Counseling session is especially important as many women are in the state of distress and they need constant and continual guidance. Counseling falls under the umbrella term talking therapies and allows people to discuss their problems and any other difficult feelings which they encounter in a safe and confidential environment. Counseling therapies and strategies are different for different person as it goes according to one's need. Counseling can also be useful for anyone who wants to explore the way they think or feeling due to a particular situation or condition. It can also help anyone experiencing and problem or issue or conflict situation and they are keen to resolve. It ultimately helps in reducing anxiety, stress, depression, etc. So in the Shakti Sadan home counseling sessions are given special importance for its client.

Medical Examination:

Medical examination is again an important and compulsory procedure which every client has to undergo. In many cases, clients are being referred since they don't admit themselves voluntarily. Initial medical examination is performed for every newly arrived clients and a separate file is maintained for each of them. Besides routine medical examination, each client is taken for medical checkups when they are unwell. Accordingly, the required medicine and ailments are provided.

Women who stay in ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home are given skill development program and allowed them to practice by 11 am to 4pm. As clients in ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home has no fix days for duration to stay in the home,

very short skill development program are specifically designed and chosen so that each one can acquire it. Short term skill development program are given with the main objective to increase earning capacity of the women who are facing constraints in their support system.

Daily routine and the activities associating it form the larger part of the life in ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home. However, observing important days and festival gives a homely feeling and also tightened the shared bond of love and care. So far, the home had given the clients the opportunity to observe their respective festivals since women belonged to various religion.

Advocacy and Networking Program:

ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home , Komlathabi, Chandel District, Manipur have good relationship with District Hospital Chandel, Primary Health Centre Komlathabi (Kapaam), Chandel District police Station and village chiefs, Social Welfare Office Chandel, Superintendent of Chandel Police, Deputy Commissioner of Chandel, youth clubs and women clubs of in and around the village, etc.

Monitoring and Evaluation:

ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home makes sure that on every third Saturday (of each month), a meeting is conducted in the main office to evaluate about the progress that is taking place in ABCEDO's Shakti Sadan Home. On this day, progresses, issues and shortcomings are brought up and discuss for the betterment of the clients and also overall growth and development of the home. Also assessment is conducted almost every day amongst clients in the presence of the counseling/project director to make sure that the clients stay without facing any problems. Keeping in mind the problems faced by the

clients, the counselor bring this up during the monthly meeting at the main office in Samaram, ABCEDO.

Christmas Celebration:

Preparation for the Christmas festival was started days before the 25th December in the ABCEDO's Sakti Sadan Home. The residing women and children took keen interest and had decorated the Ujjawala Home with colorful paper ribbon, pictures and stars and thus provided full spirit to the festival. The actual celebration started in the evening of the 25th and marked with a bonfire. All the residents sit around it and sang Christmas carol which was followed with tea and snacks. Some shared their Christmas memories from the past and followed with cultural program. The day also had a special Christmas dinner and continued with bonfire and more of songs and music.

Bye-Bye cum New Year Celebration:

Saying Goodbye to the year 2022 and welcoming 2023 was celebrated with much fun by the residents of the ABCEDO's Sakti Sadan Home. A grand dinner was prepared and every resident was taking part in it. Such a moment was a celebration in itself where everyone shares their good memories of the past year's celebrations. Post dinner session of the event stated with a bonfire in which each woman sit around it. The program continued with resolutions of the upcoming new year and then with entertainment program like song, jocks and '*Bible Reading*'.

Workshop on Trafficking Andcommercial Sex Worker:

ABCEDO's Sakti Sadan Home has organized workshop on Trafficking and Commercial Sex Worker at different area and place in handel District, Manipur in closed collaboration with Women Organisation ADC Members, Asha Workers, Angalwadi Worker, Village Chiefs and Church Leaders. In this programme, various stakeholders delivered talks about the role of NOGs, Community Leaders, Village Chiefs, Church Leaders and Women organization to prevent the commercial sexual exploitation, rescue the victim, Rehabilitation, re-integration and repartition to the participants. ABCEDO's Sakti Sadan Home has also distributed 2000 nos. of leaflets, 800 posters at major places such as Fast Food, Public Place, Bus stand and School etc. The main objective of the programme are to prevent trafficking of women and children for commercial sexual exploitation through social mobilization and involvement of local communities, awareness generation programmes, general public discourse through workshop such event and any other innovative activity and to provide rehabilitation service both immediate and long term to the victims by providing basic amenities / needs etc.

Any child and concerned adult can call 1098 and access the Childline service any time of the day or night.

VISION:

The Vision of CHILDLINE is a “child-friendly nation that guarantees the rights and protection of all children”.

MISSION:

CHILDLINE aims at responding to the needs of every child in need and care protection throughout the country and ensure that there is an integrated effort between governmental, non-governmental organisations, academic organisations, bilateral agencies, corporate sector and the community in protecting the rights of children.

TASKS OF CHILDLINE 1098:

- ❖ To reach out to every child in need of care and protection by responding to emergencies on 1098 and by physically reaching out to children.
- ❖ To adapt and integrate telecommunication technology, linking throughout districts to the service of 1098, and making it available to all children in need of care and protection.
- ❖ To provide a platform of networking amongst organisations and to provide linkages to support systems that facilitates rehabilitation of children in need of care and protection.
- ❖ To work together with all allied System (Police, Health Care, JJB, CWC, Transport, Legal, Education, Communication, Media, Political and the Community) to create child friendly systems.
- ❖ To advocate for services for children that are inaccessible, non-existent or inadequate.
- ❖ To create a body of NGOs and Government organisations of working within the national framework and policy for children.

CHILD LINE Kakching works with children in need of care and protection with the view to ensure their basic right. Usually it works with children up to 18 years of age.

OPEN HOUSE PROGRAMMES:

CHILDLINE Kakching organized 9 Open House programmes in Kakching district during the year 2022-2023. In the Open House programme preparation our team visited different villages, Municipality wards, Gram Panchayats, schools, Angalwadi centres, Self help groups, Hospitals, ASHA and other community based voluntary organisations. The whole purpose of all the Open House programmes were to discuss and come to decision addressing various problem and laxity of provisions to our children whom we educate and take care and about making best use of the childline to help out children in danger specially those caught up in misery of child labour, child marriage, physical/sexual assault, trafficking and other problems like runaway from home, missing of child etc. The children also openly shared their difficulties in their schools, boarding, coaching centers with boldness regarding the lack of toilet facilities, open playground, accommodation, meals, lack of proper teaching and so on. The Govt. department heads who participated assure of their full support take a stringent action against people who have not taken sufficient care and support to the children. The heads of the education institutions assured of their support in looking into the matter seriously and do the needful immediately.



OUTREACH ACTIVITIES:

Outreach- a cost effective awareness exercise is an important aspect of a Child Helpline in economically developing countries. It is a medium through which the helpline reaches out to children who need help but do not or cannot call in to the helpline due to lack of established telephone infrastructure or non-familiarity with phones. Outreach ensures accessibility of the helpline to even the most marginalized group of children. It could be in the form of street corner meetings, individual or



group meetings with children, organising children festivals and fairs. Target outreach areas could be public places like public park, busstops, pavements and remote villages in order to reach out to more and more children.

This year (2022-2023) our team worked 3564 hours outreach. During this outreach activities we have organized individual, small group, group meetings, street corner meetings. We also interact with village leaders, panchayat members, NGOs, CBOs, different Govt. department, Municipal counselors etc. we intervened 41 Cases. It includes- Shelter, Protection from abuse, Child marriage, Missing Emotional Support & Guidance medical cases and career guidance. etc.





COMMUNITY MEETINGS:

In Kakching district, hundreds of children require to keep under family and community safety nets and they also requiring emergency help. Violence against children, Physical/sexual abuses and exploitation of children is occurring in this state. We feel that to prevent such unwanted activities we need family and community participation in protection of child rights and providing help for children in need of care and protection. So CHILDLINE Kakching conducted Community Engagement Activities with stakeholders like–AWC, School teachers and management committee, Village Panchayat members, Health Workers, CWC members & One Stop Centre staff from time to time. Such meeting improved our activities as well as our team got their co-operation.





GRAM PANCHAYAT MEETING:

The elected representatives of village gram panchayat are responsible for ensuring the development and protecting the rights of villagers. Elected members task is to contribute to socio-economic growth and more importantly, to protect the unprotected majority of the population within the village. Many of children are unprotected and weakest section in the village. It is the responsibility of panchayat members to ensure the protection of child rights.

In spite of several efforts by the government and non-governmental organisations to support child rights, we still see many children working as labourers, being deprived of education and facing violence and abuse in their families, schools and within society.



Children are the future of our country. If we protect their health, they as healthy citizens will help contribute to the development of the country. Keeping all these facts in mind CHILDLINE Kakching organized meeting with elected representatives of the gram panchayat, to aware work together with all members of gram panchayat understand the current plight of children, their rights, and how by protecting these rights, you can ensure a safe environment for them. Our team organized meeting with Pallel Gram Panchayat, Langmdidong Gram Panchayat, Irengban Gram Panchayat, Waikhong Gram Panchayat etc.

MEETING WITH ALLIED SYSTEMS:

Allied Systems are the systems that a child comes in contact with. For example: the police system, health care, judiciary, education, including student bodies, transport, labour, media, telecommunication department, corporate sector, elected representatives and all of us! A Child Helpline needs to be in close contact with these Allied Systems to ensure a child friendly environment.

CHILDLINE Kakching developed friendly relations with Allied System with in the district and out of the district and refer the children to different organizations based on the need of the children and as per the intake policy of the organization. We are always in touch with Pradhans of Village Panchayat, CWC members, Child Care Institutions, One Stop Centre staff, Kakching Police Station, CMO office, Zonal Education Office, elected Student bodies/ organisations etc. As per our target we could achieved 04 Meeting with Allied Systems.



ANGALWADI AND ASHA WORKERS MEETINGS:

Childline Kakching always in touch with Anganwadi workers and extended co-operation in areas of providing basic health care activities include contraceptive counseling and supply, nutrition education and supplementation, as well as pre-school activities. Working on similar lines are ASHA workers. Childline Kakching organized meetings with ASHA workers from time to time and discussed about educating our community members about the importance of family planning, basic hygiene and sanitation, quality lifestyle, and information sharing etc.

During this year our team conducted 4 meetings with Angalwadi workers/helpers at different villages/towns like Sekmaijing Makha Leikai, Laphupat Khoidum, Arong Nongmaikhoidum, Hiyanglam Mayai Leikai Anganwadi centers. We also organized another 04 meetings with ASHA at PHC Pallel, PHSC Langmeidong, PHSC Mayeng Lamjao, PHSC Elangkhangpokpi.



SCHOOL AWARENESS PROGRAMMES:

Every month CHILDLINE Kakching visited schools of Kakching district with the aim that all children have an equal right to access education in an environment that is safe, protective and conducive to the overall development. During this year we the Childline Kakching has been organized 56 Awareness programme for school children on area of Childline 1098 and other child-related issues in terms of:-

- Drug Abuse among school going children
- Children needing medical help
- Missing children
- Abused children
- Mentally ill children
- Child labourers
- HIV/AIDS infected children
- Differently-abled children
- Child marriages

at different schools in Kakching District under ZEO Kakching. It is organized to reach out to school attending children regarding Childline 1098, its roles and responsibilities for children who need care and protection.

During our visit our team also pursued to the school management and ZEO for delivering better facilities to students in academic, sports, cultural, technical, media, arts, music, religious, social, and political areas which would aid them to discover their areas of interest.





CHILDREN SPECIAL PROGRAMME- “CHILDLINE SE DOSTI”& CHILDREN DAY CELEBRATION:

CHILDLINE Collab Kakching organized Children’s Day 14th November 2022 and opening day programme of CHILDLINE SE DOSTI CAMPAIGN-2022 at Adhi Boarding & Coaching Centre, Kakching Lamdong. In the Programme, Shri Th. Tompok Singh Director, Childline Kakching, Madam, Momota Soraijam, Founder Chairmen, Adhi Boarding & Coaching Centre and N Ajit Singh, Co-ordinator, Childline Kakching were graced as President, Chief Guest and Guest of Honour respectively.

The objectives of the CHILDLINE SE DOSTI CAMPAIGN-2022 campaign were –

- a) Add a million Dosts each year
- b) Involve community in activities to get their participation in CP
- c) Make Child protection everybody’s business.





Childline Kakching continued “**CHILDLINE Se Dosti campaign 2022**” at different school, coaching centres and public places. To-day we visited BDS Home for Girls, and Open Shelter Home for Girls, Keirak. We interact with children inmates and staffs of the homes. As per programme scheduled different activities like – Songs, Poem recitation, Monologue, Cultural dance etc. was performed by the inmates. On 20th November 2022, the last day of the week long “CHILDLINE Se Dost Campaign -2022” was organized at ABCEDO Observation Home for Boys, Samram at 11.45 am sharp to organized the programme. In the function, ShriKh. Tompok Singh, Secretary ABCEDO, Mr. Nepola Singh. Superintendent of Observation Home, N. Ajit Singh, Co-ordinator Childline Kakching, L. Surjit Singh, Team Head, Thoubal Sub Centre were grace on the dais. The function discussed about the campaign and the programme followed by entertainment activities for the children like- student show their talents by doing various activities like mimicry, singing, dancing, short play, English talk etc. In this programme Children could show their hidden talents. As a picnic programme, we visited at Angalching Eco Park with the children and children have refreshment at the picnic sport.

STAFF MEETINGS:

It is very important to have a trained our team dealing with children in need of care and protection. The team handling the calls from children should have knowledge of available resources and intervention strategies, a strong perspective on child rights and information about the issues and concerns of children in their area.

The initial in-house training imparted at the time of starting a helpline is an intensive training module comprising of the following sessions: a) Understanding children and their rights b) Understanding the Child Helpline- its beliefs, key concepts, structure, roles and responsibilities c) Strategies of intervention and awareness along with guidelines on documentation d) Working with Allied Systems.

The team also gets inputs from regular issue based trainings that follow the in house training. These issues are based on the identification of children’s needs.



CHILDLINE VISIBILITY:

As a part of CHILDLINE visibility CHILDLINE Kakching erected Hoarding, Wall poster, banner sticker put on walls with logo written about CHILDLINE 1098 services at different places like market areas, parks, streets, tourist areas, Govt. office walls, putting up stickers in all the public vehicles in collaboration of the district transport department. It also display about help in reaching out instantly to the child in distress, identifying issues of children, advocating for gaps in services and advocating for a child friendly environment.

It is operated within the jurisdictions of Samaram, Khongjom, Tekcham, Papal, Langathel, Langthabal, Tentha, Sapam, Langthabal, Chingtham, Khebaching, Sangaiyumpham villages of Thoubal district, Manipur. It is sponsored by the Childline India Foundation (CIF), Mumbai, under the Mission Vatsalya Scheme (Child Protection Services and Welfare Services) of Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India, New Delhi. The Childline sub-centre, Thoubal is located at Samaram Village of Thoubal District.



ABOUT THE CHILDLINE:

It is India's first 24 hrs. Toll free emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection linking them to long-term service for their care and rehabilitation. Any child and concerned adult can call 1098 and access the childline service any time of the day or night.

CASE INTERVENTIONS FOR 1st APRIL, 2022 TO 31st MARCH, 2023:

Our teams reach to the intervention spots and extend our help to the vulnerable needy family or persons.





SPECIAL CASES:

A call from childline Thoubal, namely Ibemcha at around 9:00pm on 15th April, 2022 inform us about the case related with education. On 16th April, 2022 we childline Sub-Centre, Thoubal went to the child's house and meet the child and parents also. They want to enroll their child in special school due to hearing impaired of the child. We also give proper counselling to the parents for their related education. We give needful emotional support to the child with sign language and parents support us.

Call from 1098 and inform us about special educational case on 6th June 2022. We childline sub-centre team went to the child's house on 7th June at around 2:00 pm to intervent the case and meet the child and parents also. The child is physically and mentally retarded. So, they need a special education to the child but we failed to provide their needs since the facility is not available. We counsel them and gave emotional support to the child.

Call from parent and informed us about the early elopment case on 21st July 2022 at 4:25 pm. We, childline Sub-Centre, Thoubal team cantact her parent on thatday. But unfortunately some conflict are there in the child family. So, we childline Sub-Centre informed Khongjom police OC and CWC . Then, we produce the child before CWC Wangjing on 26th July 2022 at 12:15 pm. After counselling, the child was handover to her parents.

In our outreach at Samaram, we got a case for conflict with law. One, miss Echan Devi, 30 yrs daughter of Khangembam Rajen Singh, Samaram Mayai Leikai and her mother Kh. Memcha Devi claimed to the child line that Echan had rapped by two boys in the month of February, 2022. They failed to report to the police in time since the victim is unsound(mental problem) and family is unaware. Immediately, our team guided the family and file a case to Women Police, Thoubal. The Women Team pick up the victim and the process of legal started. Victim took the name of Khangembam Paikhomba Singh & Khangembam Maniyai Singh. The two boy produced before JJB. JJB ordered to put the accuses in the home of Takyel. The victim was medically check up and confirmed concieve for seven months. Childline Sub-Centre appeal to the CWC for the safeguard of unsounded mother and child seven month. Childline ordered a letter to DCPO, Thoubal to care and

protect both mother and child. The responsible of mother and child is being taken by DCPO, Thoubal. And both the accuses are under trial.

PROJECTS /PROGRAMMES UNDERTAKEN WITH OWN FUND OF THE ORGANISATION DURING THE YEAR 2022-2023

ABCEDO'S CULTURAL DEVELOPMENT, PROMOTION AND INTEGRATION PROGRAM:

All Backward Classes and Economic Development Organisation (ABCEDO), Samaram Thoubal District, Manipur as a grassroots level organization has been working extensively in area of protection, prevention, providing sheltering and care for women and children. However, it give due focus on the promotion, protection, integration and development of culture and environment where association and collaboration with multiple agencies, institutions and organizations are made for engagement and dissemination by/to the masses at different levels.

As part of the environmental protection, promotion and developmental programme, the organization has been organizing awareness campaign on pollution, deforestation and climate change at school level with focus being given to Thoubal, Chandel and Noney districts. Further, the organization also observed events like World Environment Days, Forest Week, Ozone Layer protection Day, Earth Day etc by organizing awareness events and competitions to the theme identified specifically at school and community level.

Manipur, the Jewel of India, is also known for its rich culture heritage and diversity. The land which is inhabited by thirty plus community has strong and diverse cultural elements that are rooted and closely associated with way of life of the general masses. It has manifestations in different forms – dance, song, music, narrative art form, particular forms of handicraft and handloom with specific patterns etc.



In light of the fast growing globalised world of today where the impact of internet and mass media is indomitable, ABCEDO believes in the preservation, protection and promotion of the rich cultural heritage of the state as it forms the identity of the land and also link intensively to the overall value system of its people.

Manipur, as a state, has a long history where cultural diffusion and assimilation have occurred at different historical epoch and at varied level. However, the folk culture of the land has its unique style and expression which needs to be preserved and promote as the heritage of the mankind. Further, the cultural changes and its outcome to the state, specifically post 18th century, cannot go unrecognized. The resulting dance form - 'Manipuri Dance', is one of the classical dance forms of India and 'Shankritana' of the state is recognized by UNESCO as human heritage. Besides, the different dance forms of the existing tribal communities illustrate the multiple facet of the composite cultural milieu. So, with the objectives to preserve, protect and promote the culture and its value, ABCEDO has also been engaging and working in the field of culture with different stakeholders and masses at the grassroots level.

As part of the cultural preservation, protection and promotion programme, the organization has been organizing Cultural workshops, training, demonstration, competition etc by associating with organizations, institutions and individuals at school and community level.

Some of the activities which the organization has undertaken in the year 2022-23 are following as:

❖ **SOLO DANCE COMPETITION: CLASSICAL & FOLK:
(12th – 14th April, 2022)**

The organisation has organized a 3-days Solo Dance Competition starting from 12th April, 2022 at the premises of organisation hall. 23 Solo dance artists were participated in the programme where 12 were under the classical Solo dance category while the remaining 11 participants were competed in the category of Folk Solo Dance. The programme gives the chances to show artist in the grassroots level of their talents and personalities which could be molded for further growth and development.



❖ **3 DAYS WORKSHOP ON MANIPURI CLASSICAL DANCE:
(28th – 30th May, 2022)**

Manipuri dance is one of the classical dance forms of India. Its themes are devotional and are performed on religious occasions and in temples throughout the area. It is even often referred to as "sankirtan". The term Manipuri, Actually covers a number of dance forms from the region. The

most important being the Raas Lila and the Pung Cholom. Manipuri began to take a familiar form with the introduction of Vaishnavism in the 15th Century AD. This was first introduced by King Kyamba and greatly expanded under the support of later kings such as Khagemba, Charairongba and a host of others. The earlier forms of Manipuri had not been codified or given a scientific base. This was accomplished in the 18th century by King Bhagyachandra. He invited the major teachers and performers from all over the area to codify their art into a coherent system.



Today, Manipuri Dance is recognized as a classical dance form of very high artistic and technical standards. With a view to the above history of the Manipuri Dance and to promote it to the Younger Generation, a 3–Days Workshop on Classical Dance was organized by ABCEDO at Tekcham Bazar Community Hall from 28th to 30th May, 2022 with 4 Gurus of Manipuri Classical Dance and 20 artists.

❖ **2 DAYS FOLK DANCE FESTIVAL:
(5th – 6th July, 2022)**

The organisation has organized a 2-days Folk dance festival starting from 5th July, 2022 at Samaram Mayai Leikai Community Hall. 30 folk artists were participated in the program me under Solo and group category. Eminent Folk Dancers and Resource persons



were also invited and participated in the concluded festival. The programme gave a chance to the sprouting artist a platform to showcase their talent and also to interact and learn from the eminent Gurus and prominent dancers.

❖ **YOUTH CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMME:
(29th – 31st July, 2022)**

The organisation had conducted 3-days District Level Youth Cultural Exchange Programme starting from 10th July, 2022 at Tentha Khunjao Makha Leikai, Thoubal District, Manipur with the participation of 37 youth from Thoubal District. During the programme, different traditional culture based Folk dance and music competition were conducted. Resource persons from the State Kala Academy and Theatre activists were participated and gave valuable demonstrations, teaching and speech on the importance and development of cultural activities among the youths for national integration.



❖ **'MAHA RAAS' WORKSHOP & PRODUCTION:
(21st August – 20th September, 2022)**



Manipur is specifically famous for 'Raas Leela' which is of 4 types: Maha Raas, Diba Raas, Bashanta Raas and Nitya Raas. Even though all the types of Raas revolves around the different episodes on the life of Shri Krishna, each type has its own specific modes and technicalities. Moreover, preparing a production of Raas Leela cost a lot of effort in terms of practice, especially for the common people. However, ABCEDO organized a month long workshop to produce the most extensive for of Raas Leela called Maha Raas

by engaging a Guru and 6 technical assistances in terms of singers and musicians. The effort was made specifically by considering the rarity to watch and learn about this Raas form by today's generation even in the state of Manipur and also considering the young and enthusiast artist to learn about it for its preservation and promotion. The production was presented on 20th September 2022 at the public ground of Samaram Makha Leikai with invitation to felicitate the elderly artist which were practicing and promoting Manipuri culture. Public received the production with great appreciation.

❖ **WARI LIBA COMPETITION:
(20th - 21st October, 2022)**

A peculiar narrative art form of Manipur which is called as 'Wari Liba' is an age old tradition that has a close association with socio-cultural life of Manipurians. During the king's reign, it was all about narrating the myths, history, rituals etc. to the King by the royal scholar. After introduction of Hinduism in the kingdom, stories of Ramayana and Mahabharata were became a popular content of this art form. In view of the encouragement of such type of cultural forms, the organization has conducted a 2-days Wari Liba competition from 20th to 21st October, 2022 at Samaram Bamol Mandop (Radha Krishna Temple), Thoubal District, Manipur. The festival



is participating by 8 story tellers coming from various part of the state. The function was marked by discussion on the Wari-Liba art between the experts in the field with the participating story tellers.

❖ **SEMINAR CUM WORKSHOP ON FUSION MUSIC:
(20th – 21st February, 2023)**

Fusion music is a blend of two or more styles of music. For example, rock and roll, which developed in the United States in the 1940s and 50s, is a fusion of gospel, jazz, rhythm and blues and country music. Composers have been influenced by other world



cultures throughout history, but pop fusions have become more common since the 1960s. In Manipur, the style of fusion music is a unique style rather than other countries, it has rich tradition of tribal folk dance and Manipur

music which provides a special identity to the state culture. During the year, the organisation has organized 2 days seminar cum workshop on Fusion Music at Khongjom Bazar Community Hall, Thoubal District, Manipur from 20th to 21st February, 2023. On the first day of the programme, three popular fusion music groups from Manipur had performed and presented their work on fusion music. On the 2nd day, invited resource persons and researchers had presented paper on the history, growth and changes in fusion music.

❖ **WORKSHOP ON PRESERVATION OF TRADITION CULTURE:
(10th March, 2023)**

Traditional culture is considered as a valuable resource, creating a unique tourist attraction for each country. However, knowing how to use this heritage for sustainable tourism development, while preserving and promoting the heritage value for future generation is not a simple task. It is necessary to have sustainable development in active culture conservation, as well as the relationship between the preservation, promotion of the traditional culture and the socio-economic development and environment. In this regard, the organisation has also look into the matter of preservation and promotion of cultural heritage since the last year onward. During the reporting period, the Organisation has organized 1-day awareness programme on Preservation and Promotion of Cultural Heritage at Khongjom Bazar Community Hall, Thoubal District, Manipur with the participation of local youths on 10th March, 2023.

HANDLOOM AND HANDICRAFTS TRAINING PROGRAMME:

ABCEDO had conducted Awareness Program on Handloom and Handicrafts especially for rural poor needy women at Leishangthem Community Hall of Thoubal District, Manipur in association with District Industrial Centre (DIC), Thoubal Manipur. 70 women including girls from Leishangthem Village and its neighbouring Village of Thoubal District, Manipur took part in the program. As a part of the Program, ABCEDO has provided training materials to some selected trainees with free of cost. The main objectives of the Program are to improve the income level of the rural poor needy women through Handloom and Handicrafts Development Program.

PIGGERY FARMING TRAINING:

All Backward Classes and Economic Development Organization in closed collaboration with District Veterinary Office, Thoubal, Government of Manipur organized one day awareness programme on Piggery Farming/ Rearing at Langathel village of Thoubal District, Manipur. 90 villagers from Langathel and its adjoining village of Thoubal District, Manipur were participated in the programme. Resource person from District Veterinary Office, Thoubal and Khongjom were delivered talks to the participants about the needs of piggery farming / rearing as earning way as well as improving socio-economic status in the rural areas through modern scientific technology.

POULTRY FARMING TRAINING:

With a view to reduce the unemployment problem in rural area as well as improve the income level of the poor villagers through Poultry developments program. ABCEDO has organized one day awareness programme on Poultry Farming / Rearing at Tekcham Maning Leikai Community Hall, Thoubal District, Manipur in closed collaboration with District Veterinary Office, Thoubal and Khongjom, District Social Welfare Office, Thoubal, Government of Manipur. 156 villagers from Tekcham and its adjoining village of Thoubal District were participated in the programme. Resource person from District Veterinary office, Thoubal and Khongjom were delivered talks to the participants about the needs of Poultry Farming / Rearing as earning way as well as improving socio-economic status in the rural areas through modern scientific technology.

SWASTHA BHARAT MISSION PROGRAMME:

ABCEDO had organized Swachh Bharat Mission programme at ABCEDO's Observation Home for Boys Samaram and ABCEDO's Children Home for Boys, Noney respectively on from April to June, 2022 under the financial support from Social Welfare Department, Government of Manipur. The main purpose of this programme was to create awareness among the Children of the Home regarding cleanliness and its benefits, Covid-19 prevention etc. During the programme, the resource person took delivered the speech on the importance of sanitation, Covid-19 Dos and Don'ts, Hand Sanitization and proper use of face marks etc. In the end we all took oath of keeping our home, locality and city clean. It was a unique experience for all of us. We were curious to be the part of this great drive that could have transformed the face of our country forever.
